4th of July Reminders

NORCOM wants to remind you to keep the 9-1-1 lines open for real emergencies this 4th of July. If you are reporting a non-emergency for a noise complaint, fireworks complaint or any other event where there are no injuries, fire, or immediate threat please call the non-emergency line at 425-577-5656.

If you have an emergency, you should call 9-1-1 immediately. This would include any immediate threat to life or property.

Most cities that NORCOM serves have banned fireworks however you will want to check your local city website for further information and instructions. As always, safety is our top priority. NORCOM will have additional staff on site to assist in the increase of calls and most police and fire departments will have increased staffing to help keep you all safe. Be aware of your surroundings and report anything that does not look right to 9-1-1.
